<p>In key stage 1, they learn about Christians and their beliefs.</p> <p>Before the start of the unit, they will understand that Christmas is celebrating the birth of Jesus.</p>	<p>Children will explore the concept of angels – what they believe an angel to be and how others view angels. They will view art based around angels, considering how they look.</p> <p>They will then link angels to the birth of Jesus.
