


<p>In year 3 and year 4, children have learnt about Ritual linked to Sukkot (Judaism) and Paschal Candle (Christianity)</p> <p>In year 5 and year 6, children have learnt about different aspects of Islam including creation beliefs, Shahada, Salat, Hajj and Zakat.</p>	<p>Children will explore the concept of Ritual – what it means to them and others. They will learn about different rituals that people have and the reasons behind them.</p> <p>They will then link this to 2 of the rituals within Islam – Wudu and Eid-ul-Fitr (linked to 2 pillars Salat and Sawm)</p>	<p>In SUM2 Y6, children will learn more about Islam including about the Qur’an, Ramadan and Sawm.</p>	<p>Wudu – ritual washing performed by Muslims before prayer</p> <p>Qur’an – holy book of Islam, which Muslims believe is Gods words recited to Mo</p> <p>hammed through the Angel Gabriel</p> <p>Fasting – no eating or drinking</p>	<p>Ramadan – ninth month in the Muslim calendar, during which strict fasting is observed from dawn to sunset.</p> <p>Eid-ul-Fitr – festival of Breaking the Fast, which marks the end of the Holy Month of Ramadan.</p>
